MATHS:

We will learn to use symbols for pounds and pence, combine amounts to make specific values, and tell/write the time to the nearest five minutes. We'll also compare and sequence time intervals, understand minutes in an hour and hours in a day, and use math vocabulary for position, directions and movement. Additionally, we'll estimate and measure length, height, mass, temperature, and capacity using appropriate units. We'll continue solving problems using our knowledge of the 2, 5, and 10 times tables.

ENGLISH

We will be writing an information text on plants based on 'Our world in pictures: Trees, Leaves Flowers and Seeds'. We will write a character description using exciting vocabulary, suffixes and conjunctions. We will be reading the poem 'Strange' by Valerie Bloom and using this to create our own poetry. Our class reads will begin with: 'A Lion in Paris' by Beatrice Alemagna. We will continue practising writing effective sentences, editing our work and as always with a real focus on handwriting and presentation.
